Dear Mr. Newcomb:

I wanted to take a moment to express our appreciation for your participation in the formation of the new MAPP Community Advisory Council (CAC) and your serving on the CAC as a liaison to the County Council. As we have said before, we are committed to fully engaging the public in the multi-year MAPP process. The new CAC underscores and strengthens this commitment.

Attached is a copy of the final list of participants and a copy of the letter asking for their participation on the CAC.

I understand that you recently received a letter from Ms. Libby Nagel of Dorchester Citizens for Safe Energy (DCSE) in which she expressed her concern about your participation in the CAC before all of her group's outstanding questions about the project have been resolved. We recognize that she, and many others, continue to have questions about the project.

Many of the environmental questions will be answered as various studies are completed. Very detailed environmental studies will be conducted and will be made available upon filing of the CPCN.

While we wait for those studies to be completed, there is still great benefit in continuing with the formation of the MAPP CAC. Just as you feel a deep responsibility to the community to listen to their concerns and represent their interests regarding MAPP, we have a responsibility to engage them in the MAPP process. The CAC is one more tool to build community involvement and encourage dialogue.

Those questions for which we have answers were addressed in a letter we sent to DCSE on February 11, 2009. For example, Ms. Nagel was interested in other alternative transmission lines that were considered by PJM before the MAPP line was selected. Our letter directed her to the report on PJM's Web site that discusses the criteria for selection and the benefits of this decision for the electrical grid.

We also have provided detailed information about the project to Ms. Nagel and others at several community meetings in February and March and continue to meet with the DCSE to continue the dialogue and provide new information as it becomes available.

As we have previously stated, all of the questions she has asked will be answered throughout the extensive Public Service Commission (PSC) CPCN process. To recap, the Maryland PSC will examine:

- The need for the line
- The effect of the line on historic, aesthetic, recreational, archeological, forest, agricultural and other land uses
- Public input process and its effect on route choice
- All environmental impacts of the line including permitting

We think that moving forward with the CAC now is important to our outreach efforts, as it will provide a regular forum for the exchange of information and ideas between the MAPP team and leaders in the community who represent the interests of all Dorchester County residents. We hope we can look forward to your continued assistance as we bring this group together.
